“The Irish Human Rights and Equality Commission Act 2014 introduced a duty on the public sector that brings a focus on non-discrimination, equality and human rights centre-stage in planning, policy-making and service provision. It is a legal requirement on public bodies to take proactive steps to promote equality, protect human rights and prohibit discrimination (for employees and people

accessing public services) in carrying out their functions. That the local authority commit to meeting its obligations under section 42 of the Irish Human Rights and Equality Commission Act

(2014) by:

(i) As a matter of urgency, develop a plan for a implementing the Public Sector Duty

(ii) Embed a values-based approach to integrating human rights and equality objectives in its approach to implementing the Public Sector Duty

(ii) Commit to ensuring participation by organisations representing groups experiencing inequality and human rights violations in developing and implementing the plan.”
